Eastwoodhill Arboretum

Eastwoodhill Arboretum is the largest and most comprehensive collection of Northern Hemisphere trees south of the equator. A variety of graded and marked walking tracks are suitable for all levels of fitness and mobility.

Entry fees

Adult	\$10
Senior citizen (over 65)	\$8
Children (under 16)	FREE
Members	FREE

A 10% discount applies to adults in groups of 10 or more.

Eastwoodhill Arboretum is a charitable trust and donations are welcome.

Guided tours

The best way to learn about the stunning collections of Eastwoodhill Arboretum is with a guided tour.

General walking tour\$5 per person
Enjoy all the highlights of the Homestead Garden and arboretum.

Four-wheel drive tour \$10 per person
Experience all 135 hectares of the arboretum with a 4x4 jeep and chariot tour seating up to 10 people.

All tours need to be pre-booked and prices are in addition to the entry fee. Minimum charge of \$50 for any tour. A 10% discount applies to members.

Seminars and retreats

The Douglas Cook Centre library is the ideal venue for your next seminar, conference, retreat or team building exercise.

Facilities include a whiteboard, OHP, video and digital projector as well as phone, fax and email.

The library's French doors open onto a tranquil paved garden courtyard – the perfect setting for morning and afternoon teas, lunches and evening meals. Catering can be provided by Eastwoodhill's own Tasty Leaf Catering by prior arrangement.

Team building activities in the arboretum can also be arranged on request.

Educational resources

The staff at Eastwoodhill Arboretum can tailor workshops and activities to meet your educational requirements.

A well resourced library, herbarium and microscopes are available at the Douglas Cook Centre for school and university groups to use.

Out in the park, school group guided tours are an excellent way to learn about the history, tree collections and birdlife of the arboretum.

Other educational activities include orienteering, arts and craft, and seed planting.

Library hire is \$100/half day or \$175/full day. Maximum capacity 60 people.

Accommodation

Immerse yourself in the beauty of our very own national arboretum when you enjoy a stay at Eastwoodhill's Douglas Cook Centre.

Studio unit \$80 per night

A separate unit with twin beds opening out onto a small deck. Shared fully equipped kitchen and bathroom facilities. All bed linen supplied. Bring your own towels.

Bunkrooms..... \$25 per night per person

Comfortable budget-style accommodation in three air-conditioned units sleeping up to 22 people. Bring your own bed linen, food, drink and towels. Shared fully equipped kitchen and bathroom facilities.

Eastwoodhill provides an inspirational environment for art and craft groups, study groups, walking groups or groups of friends after some quality time together.

Tasty Leaf Catering can prepare delicious snacks, lunches and evening meals by prior arrangement.

Please remember to pick up your supplies on the way – the closest shops are in Gisborne, 35km from the arboretum.
